

Match Procedure:

Times:

7:30am – Setup begins - Volunteers are encouraged to assist
8:30am – Registration / Sign-up begins
9:00am – Safety Briefing. Followed by event startup

Fees:

Limit 2 runs per course of fire for each event

\$ 5.00 – Action Handgun or Action Rifle Match Fee per Run

\$10.00 – Action Two-Gun Match Fee per Run

FREE - Members first course of fire

FREE – Shooters under 15yrs of age

Example:

Member can sign up for 2 runs Handgun and 2 runs Twogun maximum.

- \$ 5 = Free first run + \$ 5 second run Handgun
- + \$10 = Free first run + \$10 second run Twogun

\$15 = Total (will cost non-members \$30)

- All participants must sign a Release of Liability Waiver (one per year)
- Please be on time, if not early, in order to hear complete instructions for the day's courses of fire and prevent delays for other shooters.
- Every shooter will run the course of fire once per match fee.
- CCW holders:

Please unload your carry gun at your vehicle before proceeding to sign-in. Exercise caution when readying all equipment before the event begins. Be sure to follow the Rules and Regulations listed in regards to handling and storing firearms as well as practical common sense.

SAFETY:

- Follow the fundamental firearm safety rules at all times:
 - **ALWAYS** keep a firearm pointed in a safe direction; either downrange or towards the ground. (The backstops are considered a safe downrange direction)
 - ALWAYS keep your finger off the trigger until ready to shoot
 - ALWAYS keep a firearm unloaded until told to load by a Range Safety Officer [RSO]
- Proper eye and ear protection **MUST** be worn at all times while in front of parking lot pylons.
- **DO NOT** handle any firearm while behind the line without approval from an RSO.
- **NEVER** handle any firearm while someone is forward of the firing line.
- No loaders may be in any firearm (speed loaders or magazines) until you are told to load by a RSO.
- Do not anticipate a RSO's command; wait and listen for all commands.
- Adhere to an appropriate personal conduct (be courteous, limit profanity, etc.)
- If you have any questions or concerns, please bring them to the attention of the nearest RSO.
 - Club RSO's please raise your hand

Event Emergency Response:

Request volunteer for each task and confirm their duties during the event.

If the volunteer leaves before the event ends:

- They are responsible to find a substitute for their task
- They must inform the Range Officer of their replacement.
- 911 Caller Call 911 and request ambulance
- Medical Respond to injury
- Road Director Drive up to the gate and direct the ambulance to the range
- Range officer Secure the firearm and clear the range.

ECCL ACTION SHOOTING

STRATEGY * ACCURACY * SPEED

Action Handgun Rules and Regulations:

- All pistols **MUST** be either holstered with the action open, or benched with the muzzle pointed downrange and the action open.
- All revolvers **MUST** be either holstered with a closed, empty cylinder, or benched with the muzzle pointed downrange and an open, empty cylinder.
- No loaders may be in any handgun (speed loaders or magazines) until you are told to load by a RSO.
- During any course of fire, **ALWAYS** keep the muzzle pointed in a safe direction; muzzle below horizon, obey 180° rule.
- Do not execute any course of fire in an unsafe or dangerous manner.
- If you have a malfunction or misfire, fix it or allow assistance from a RSO.
- Always show an empty, clear firearm at the end of your run.

Action Rifle Rules and Regulations:

- All rifles **MUST** be either placed on the provided rack with the action open and safety flag inserted, or benched with the muzzle pointed downrange, action open and safety flag inserted. Some flags have been provided and can be found atop the rifle rack.
- No magazines or ammunition may be in any rifle until you are told to load by a RSO
- During any course of fire, **ALWAYS** keep the muzzle pointed in a safe direction; muzzle below horizon, obey 180° rule.
- Do not execute any course of fire in an unsafe or dangerous manner.
- If you have a malfunction or misfire, fix it or allow help from a RSO.
- Always show an empty, clear firearm at the end of your run. Re-insert safety flag after instructed to do so.

Action Two-Gun Rules and Regulations:

- Follow all of the preceding rules and regulations outlined for both Action Handgun and Action Rifle



Range Commands:

CEASE FIRE

Anyone may call a cease fire upon witnessing any unsafe condition. Upon hearing this command; <u>immediately</u> yell out "CEASE FIRE", then stop all action, remove your finger from the trigger and keep the muzzle pointed in a safe direction. Await further instructions from a Range Safety Officer.

• Who is responsible for the safety on this range?

EVERYONE'S hand is to be raised in agreement

- Who can call a "Cease Fire"? EVERYONE'S hand is to be raised in agreement
- Call out "CEASE FIRE" <u>EVERYONE</u> yells it back "CEASE FIRE"
 - May have to call out "Cease Fire" multiple times to ensure all participate

Before Course of Fire:

- **Shooter Up** Report to the start position with your equipment ready.
- Shooter On Deck Ready all equipment and prepare to begin your course of fire
 DO NOT handle any firearms until told so by a Range Officer.
- Shooter In The Hole
 Begin to ready your equipment for your course of fire
 DO NOT handle any firearms until told so by a Range Officer.

During Course of Fire:

- **Range is hot** Eye and Ear protection must be on. Be prepared as the live fire and drills are now authorized to start.
- **Make Ready** Ready yourself for the course of fire as outlined during the pre-match course instructions.
- **Standby** Prepare to begin the course of fire on the buzzer.
 - Do not anticipate the buzzer, but wait for the audible "beep"
 - *Trigger, Trigger, Trigger -* Check the position of your trigger finger.
 - Do not have your trigger finger inside the trigger guard while moving or off target.
 - *Muzzle, Muzzle, Muzzle -* Check the direction your muzzle is pointed.
 - Always keep the muzzle pointed in a safe direction
 - Muzzle below horizon, 180° rule side to side.
- **Cover, Cover, Cover** Utilize the proper use of provided cover or concealment, reducing exposure to the threat targets.

End of Course of Fire:

- Unload, Show Clear Unload your firearms, remove all loaders and ammunition, present an open chamber to be verified by the RSO
- **Range is Safe / Clear** The course of fire has ended, all firearms cleared and the range is determined safe (cold range), hearing protection can be removed.
 - Volunteers can now move forward to score and tape targets



Required Equipment:

Action Handgun

- A semi-automatic pistol or revolver in safe operating condition.
- A safe, strong side holster of good quality construction.
 - Holster must facilitate one-handed draw and re-holster.
 - Holster must be at least 50% rigid and encase the entire trigger guard of the pistol.
 - Shoulder holsters or holsters that orient the muzzle behind the shooter are not permitted.
 - Holsters with release mechanisms that utilize the shooters trigger finger to release (SERPA and similar) are not permitted.
- At least 3 magazines or speed loaders.
- At least 50rds of appropriate, safe ammunition.
 - No steel core or bimetal projectiles permitted for courses using steel targets.
- A safe ammunition carrier of good quality construction.

Action Rifle

- A semi-automatic rifle or carbine in safe operating condition (other actions may be used). Legally owned automatic firearms must be fired in semi-automatic mode only. Must show NFA paperwork for NFA items.
- At least 3 magazines or loaders.
- At least 50rds of appropriate, safe ammunition.
 - No steel core or bimetal projectiles permitted for courses using steel targets.
- A two-point attachment sling that facilitates ambidextrous operation and that orients the muzzle in a safe direction when free hanging.
- A safe, sturdy ammunition carrier of good quality construction.
- An Open Chamber Indicator; aka Safety Flag, EIC, etc.

Action Two-Gun

• All requirements listed above for Action Handgun and Action Rifle.

ECCL Action Shooting Scoring Procedure:



o Run time is recorded with an electronic shot timer.• Time ends at last shot fired

o Hits are scored as outlined below:

- A Zone hit: Opts D Zone hit: 3pts
- B Zone hit: 1pts •
- Misses: 10pts
- C Zone hit: 2pts
- Penalties: 5pts
- Hostages = Miss + Penalty: 15pts

o Total points dropped are added together and multiplied by a time factor of 0.5 seconds per point

o Run Time + (Point Dropped*0.5) = Overall Time

*Note: Courses using reactive/steel targets do not have different scoring zones. Hits on these targets count as 0pts and misses count as 10pts. These targets may have a prescribed number of shots or may be fired upon until hit depending on the course of fire.

Action Rifle/Two-Gun Classifications:

o Men's Optic o Men's Iron Sight o Women's Optic o Women's Iron Sight o Youth Optic o Youth Iron Sight o Rimfire Optic o Rimfire Iron Sight



Hints and Tips:

- Come prepared to the match, this will prevent undue stress and allow you to focus on the day's events and not waste time rushing to find equipment.
- Weather conditions can be unpredictable. Bring appropriate gear for all conditions including raincoat, hat, warm clothing (for cool days), etc.
- Wear suitable clothing. Range conditions may vary; long pants and boots/hiking shoes are a good choice.
- Bring a water bottle or sports beverage (avoid soda or other drinks), keeping hydrated on hot summer days is important. A hot beverage may be preferred on some cooler days though!!!
- Each course of fire combines accuracy, strategy and speed. Combing these factors will result in an overall time you will be pleased with and enjoyable run.
- Run each course of fire at your own pace, pushing yourself only enough to stay safe. <u>As a great instructor once said</u>, "**Slow is smooth, smooth is fast**"
