Range Cart Policy and Guidelines for Use

- All current ECCL range rules apply regardless of whether the cart is in use or not.
- No one under 18 years old may operate the cart, per ECCL Vehicle Policy
- The cart is provided for changing targets only. There are to be no firearms carried in the cart and no shooting from the cart.
- The cart is provided to be used on the 100-, 200- and 300-yard ranges only. Any other use must have prior approval by the ECCL Board of Trustees.
- The cart is NOT to be used in the parking lot, or in the vicinity of parked vehicles.
- The cart is provided to be used by qualified, general members only. Any shooting program needs or maintenance activity will use a different vehicle.
- The cart must be parked completely behind the firing line while there is any firing. The preferred location is between the range cover and the High-Power building.
- The cart is provided to be used by qualified members only. Members must get a cart endorsement by:
 - Paying the Cart Access Fee - \$20
 - Completing the orientation session
- Upon completion of the above, the lock on the cart building will be programmed to allow qualified members access to the cart. Access will be through the door that can be unlocked using the swipe-card membership badge. The overhead door for the cart can then be opened from the inside of the building.
- Each user is required to sign in the cart logbook that he is using the cart.
- Each member is responsible for inspecting the cart for flat tires, gas or any damage that may be present. If any of these items are discovered, they are to be reported to a Board member or Range Safety Officer immediately.

- Each user is responsible for any damage to the cart, club property or parked vehicles while they are using the cart. If any accidents occur, a Board member or Range Safety Officer must be notified immediately.
- Each user is responsible for returning the cart to the building, and securing the building, when they have finished using the cart.
- Users who do not comply with this policy will be denied cart privileges and may be subject to discipline by the Board of Trustees.
